PHOENIX (AP) — Quinton McCracken knew what he had to do. Minutes after Juan Uribe's bases-

clearing double put Colorado up 5-4, McCracken responded with a two-run double that sent the Arizona Diamondbacks to an 8-5 victory over the Rockies on Tuesday night.

Tony Womack followed with a tworun homer to cap Arizona's four-run comeback to match the four runs the Rockies scored in the top of the eighth.

Arizona closer Byung-hyun Kim blew his fourth save in 30 chances when he gave up Uribe's three-run double.

But Kim (4-1) wound up with the win after working a shaky, but scoreless ninth.

McCracken, who was drafted by Colorado in 1992, came into the game in left field as part of a double switch move paid off handsomely.

"When we bring BK into the game in the eighth inning, we want to, obviously, give ourselves the option to use him in the ninth also," manager Bob Brenly said. "We had to make a double switch somewhere. There really was no logical candidate where we had ended the inning before, but (Luis Gonzalez) had made the last out, and that gave us the most possible hitters before the pitcher's spot would come up again.'

Todd Jones (1-2) got the loss after allowing all four Arizona runs on five hits in the eighth. He had not allowed a run or hit in five previous games against the Diamondbacks.

Womack drove in three runs, hitting an RBI single in the fifth and his second homer — his first in 329 at-bats since April 6 — in the eighth.
