Two Colorado football players plead guilty to alcohol charges BOULDER, Colo. (AP) — Two ships of four players, including Harris, Colorado football players pleaded but he would not identify the other

guilty Thursday to providing alcohol to a minor and were given 18-month deferred sentences.

Alexander also must perform 36 hours of community service and submit to random drug tests, prosecutor Pete Maguire said. They pleaded to misdemeanor
