MANKATO, Minn. (AP) — The NFL Players Association claims the Minnesota Vikings and Kansas City Chiefs may have engaged in collusion in their negotiations with unsigned first-round draft picks Bryant McKinnie and Ryan Sims. The union filed a request for an investigation on Monday with the NFL Management Council, ESPN.com first reported Tuesday.

The union claims the teams may have had knowledge of the signing bonus offered to a player picked after Sims and McKinnie — which is not permitted—and subsequently offered the two players a lower amount.

Sims and McKinnie were picked with the sixth and seventh picks, respectively. The No. 8 pick who the union said was offered the larger signing bonus was safety Roy Williams.
