# Anonymous donor helps Washburn

TOPEKA (AP) — An anonymous donor has given \$1 million to help build a new football stadium at Washburn University, president Jerry Farley said.

The donation brings the stadium's

its goal to proceed with the work, Farley announced Sunday at the annual Ichabod Club kickoff. Farley declined to say anything

more about the donor, except that the million. money came from an individual, not a

\$4.35 million. The Washburn Board of Regents is expected to approve a bid for construction at its September meeting. Construction would then begin after the Icahbods' last home game on Nov. 2 and be ready for the start of the 2003 football season.

Farley said the donor will be allowed to make a recommendation for a name for the stadium, but the name will be selected by the regents.

The campaign also received a \$500,000 gift last year from Bernie Bianchino, an Overland Park businessman who played football at Washburn. The university will put up another \$2


