Mr. Berry was born in Trego County on a farm close to what is now Cedar Bluff Dam on Dec. 28, 1924. He started school at Columbia, a

He married Ellen Claar on Aug. 26, 1955 and they established their farm southeast of Winona.

He was a member of the Church of Christ and became a resident of the Kansas Soldiers Home in December of 1999.
