Fans will not want to miss the last race of the 2002 season at Thomas County Speedway. The super fast ASCS 360 Winged Sprint Cars will be an added attraction to Sunday's races. According to track promoter Kerry Wark the ASCS people have projected a car count of at least 25 to 30 or more. The ASCS sanctioned cars have a slightly different wing and engine configuration than the NCRA 360 Sprints, the group that ran here last year. The

ASCS cars hail from all over the Mid United States as opposed to the mostly Kansas based NCRA cars.

A very close battle is heating up in the point's race for the track championship in the super stock and the bomber division.

In the bomber division, a classic Goodland vs. Colby showdown is shaping up between points leaders #87m Johnny Ohrman of Colby with 273 points and #43J Jarrod Smades of Goodland with 271 points. Only eight points separate the first three points

leaders in the Super Stock division. Menlo's #27 Todd Schwarz holds a narrow two point lead over Monument's Travis Towns #3 with Colby's #15 Brad Wagoner only six points behind. Lamar, Colo. driver Darren DeLoach #21 has a commanding 29 point lead over nearest competitor #38 K. B. Murphy of Scott City in the Modified division but an upset is not impossible in the Modified division
