Ross Milton Tygart, Jr., 85, former Brewster resident, died Wednesday, July 31, 2002, in Ocoee, Fla. Services were held in Brewster Cemetery on Saturday, Aug. 17 at 11 a.m. with Rev. Roger Michael officiating.

Mr. Tygart is survived by a son Robert of Vista, Calif. and a daughter, Janet Davis of Orlando, Fla.

He was preceded in death by his wife Millicent (Mickey), who died in October of 2001.

Mr. Tygart was active in many areas of civic service, serving on the Brewster Town Council and volunteering with both the Cub and Boy Scouts. He served as Pack Master and also taught gun safety to the Boy Scouts. He was also active for several years with the Brewster Senior Center.

He was a Master Mason and Post Master of the Rexford Lodge. He received his 50-year membership pin from the Masonic Lodge last year and was a member of the Shrine, ELKS Club, VFW and American Legion.

Mr. Tygart was first and foremost a family man. He turned down promotions on the Rock Island Railroad because he would have to travel and he said he didn't want to miss one day of his family growing up.

He retired from the Rock Island Railroad after 30 years of service. In that 30 years, he only missed work twice: once when one of his children gave him the Mumps and one other time when he had pneumonia. He trained several future Rock Island agents.

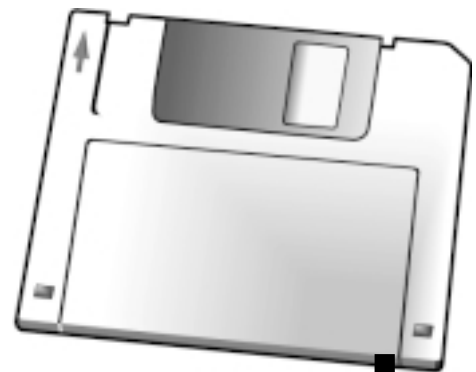
