## Kountry Kitchen

The combination of fruit and cheese cake...makes a perfect fall dessert.

#### **Nectarine Cheesecake**

Crust: 14 graham cracker squares

2 teaspoons sugar

1/2 teaspoon cinnamon 6 tablespoons margarine, melted Filling:

12 oz cream cheese, softened

1/2 cup sugar

2 eggs

1/2 teaspoon vanilla

2 nectarines, peeled, pitted and diced

Cover bottom rack in oven with foil, place second rack above foil lined rack. Heat oven to 350 degrees. Crush graham crackers finely in food processor. Add 2 teaspoons sugar and cinnamon; pulse to blend. Add margarine; pulse until crumbs begin to stick together. Press crumbs over bottom and up sides of 9-inch spring form pan.

In bowl beat cream cheese and 1/2 cup sugar until smooth. Add eggs and vanilla and beat until blended. Fold in half of nectarine pieces. (Sprinkle remaining pieces with a little sugar, cover and save for top of cake.) Pour batter over crumbs in pan.

Bake on second rack for 30-35 minutes, until set. Cool to room temperature...then refrigerate for about 2 hours. Remove side of pan. Sprinkle remaining nectarine pieces around edge.

Serve immediately. Makes 8 servings.
