Butter muffin halves and place buttered side down in 9 x 13-inch baking pan. Top muffins with prepared sausage. Beat together eggs, sour cream, and chilies and pour over sausage layer. Spread grated cheese evenly over top of egg mixture. Cover and let set overnight in refrigerator. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Makes 12 generous servings and is great with fresh fruit and muffins. Freezes well.
