Lady Eagle spikers win sub-state

After a bye in the first round of substate play Saturday in Pratt, Colby defeated Hugoton 15-6, 15-5 to advance to the championship match. Hugoton had beaten Ulysses 19-17, 4-15, 15-10. In the bottom half of the bracket, Scott City had defeated Larned 15-0, 15-4, to set up a semi-final match with the Goodland Cowgirls, who had


beaten Pratt 15-1, 15-0. The #1-seeded Eagles needed just two games to beat the #3-seeded Cowgirls, 15-11, 15-5.

The Cowgirls ended their season 25-11. The Lady Eagles are now 30-3 as they head to the state tourney.

Lackey became the first rookie had one of the most dominant Series starter to win Game 7 in 93 years.


