Chiefs' battered defense takes yet another hit

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Kan-sas City's beleaguered defense took doing all right," Vermeil said. "He's another blow Wednesday when linebacker Lew Bush was suspended four ship. He'll work heavily in that right games after testing positive for a banned substance.

The Chiefs said the action was taken after a routine test by the league, which ordered the suspension because of a violation of its "anabolic steroid and substance policy.'


