
The Eagles had 4 players scoring in double figures in the contest. Summar Stephens scored 18 of her team high 23 points in the first half. Stephens was also credited with 4 rebounds, 2 steals and a season high 7 assists.

Bethanie Linden recorded a double double scoring 21 points, hauling down 10 rebounds, 3 steals and 3 assists. Amanda Seemann and Brianna Swafford both finished the game with 10 points apiece. Seemann was credited with 6 boards, 1 steal and 3 assists, while Swafford came away with 5 rebounds, 2 assists and led the team with 5 steals. Samantha Wolf added 6 points, 2 boards, 1 steal, 2 assists and blocked 1 shot.

Before fouling out early in the fourth quarter, Emily Sloan contributed 4 points, 2 rebounds and 1 blocked shot. Desiree Sharp scored 3 points, grabbed 5 rebounds and had 1 steal. 
