ers are encouraged to attend a special meeting on beef herd health issues beginning at noon on Wednesday, Jan. 8, 2003, at the Hoxie Elks Lodge.

"Several producers in our area have experienced health problems that seem to be related to persistent BVD infections," said Sandy Johnson, beef specialist at Kansas State Research and Extension. "BVD is a complex virus that may cause respiratory problems, reproductive loss, intestinal disease and immunosuppression."

The meeting was developed, Johnson said, to help producers understand more about the virus and persistent infections and how they can reduce chances of disease exposure by their overall approach to herd health. Speakers will include Larry Hollis, extension beef veterinarian for Kansas State Research and Extension, who will discuss "Biosecurity and Your Whole Herd Health Plan," followed by "Controlling Costs and Losses from BVD Persistent Infections," presented by Dr.

Dale Groteluschen, senior veterinarian for Pfizer Animal Health, she said.


