

Brewster Junior High girls off to fast start

The Brewster Junior High A-team girl's opened their basketball season winning four in a row before finally losing to Golden Plains 30-24 on Jan 8. The first two games of their season were in late November, in the pre-season tourney. Brewster beat Wheatland 65-25, and defeated Sharon Springs 53-44. In late December, before the break, the girls defeated Cheylin 51-18 and took on Grinnell, winning 44-14.

Against Wheatland, Avery Schultz led the Brewster girls with 19 points and 11 rebounds. Audrey Hoyt scored 16, with 7 rebounds, Sarah Flanders scored 8 and hauled down 12 boards, Meghan Allen scored 8 with 7 rebounds, Abbie Allen scored 4, Baylee Westover scored 4, Emily Carney scored 6, Melissa Baird had 4 rebounds and Kily Miller had 1 board.

Against Sharon Springs, Schultz poured in 24 points and had 7 rebounds. Flanders scored 12 and had 5 rebounds, Hoyt scored 9 with 3 boards, Meghan Allen scored 3 points, Abbie Allen had a rebound, Emily Carney had two rebounds, Melissa Baird scored 5 points and

had 9 rebounds, and Baylee Westover and Kily Miller also played.

Against Cheylin, Schultz had 15 points and 14 rebounds, Hoyt scored 6 and had 6 rebounds, Flanders scored 3 points and had 4 boards, Meghan Allen scored 3 and grabbed 10 rebounds, Abbie Allen scored 4 and got a rebound, Baylee Westover scored 6 and had 3 boards, Carney and Baird scored 7 each. Carney had 5 rebounds and Baird 4. Kily Miller didn't score, but had 2 rebounds.

Against Grinnell, Schultz had 17 points and 10 rebounds, Hoyt had 10 points and 2 rebounds, Flanders had 2 points and 2 rebounds, Meghan Allen had 4 points and 2 boards, Abbie Allen had 2 points, Westover had 2 rebounds, Carney scored 2 and had 4 rebounds, Baird scored 7 and had 5 rebounds, and Kily Miller had a rebound.

In Brewster's first loss, against Golden Plains, Hoyt had 9 points, Schultz had 6, Flanders 5, Meghan Allen had 2 and Melissa Baird had 2 points.

Colorado snaps Wildcat win streak despite troubles

BOULDER, Colo. (AP)—Colorado was already without point guard Mookie Wright, who faces disciplinary action because of a dormitory incident. Then center David Harrison got in foul trouble.

Michel Morandais took up the slack, scoring 25 points as the Buffaloes snapped Kansas State's eight-game winning streak with a 69-63 win on Wednesday night.

Morandais had five of his points in the final 3:13, helping withstand a K-State rally.

Moments later, Wilson's two free throws gave Colorado its biggest lead, 57-44.

Siebrandt had four baskets in a 9-0 run that made it 57-53.

Wilson then hit a 3-pointer with 4:18 left, and Morandais followed with a short jumper and a 3-pointer for a 65-54 lead with 1:16 left.

A pair of 3-point baskets by Gilson DeJesus in the final 27 seconds made the score respectable.

K-State's comeback hopes were hurt by poor free-throw shooting (3-of-12) in the second half.

"You can size this game up easily: We lost this game at the free-throw line," Wooldridge said.

Harrison, Colorado's 7-foot sophomore center who led the team in scoring for most of the season, played only 24 minutes, fouling out with 2:55 left after scoring seven points.

Wright didn't play at all after the school's Office of Judicial Affairs ruled Tuesday he had violated the student conduct code for allegedly entering the room of a freshman coed on Oct. 11 and making unwanted sexual advances.

In his absence, McGee, a freshman, played 34 minutes and finished with eight points, five assists and four rebounds.

"I've been starting most of the season anyway," McGee said. "I haven't had the experience late in games, but my teammates kept pushing me forward."

Patton said McGee "hit some shots early. That's what we need him to do, become an offensive threat out there."

Morandais scored 14 points in the first half as Colorado took a seven-point halftime lead.

Morandais' second of three 3-pointers in the half gave Colorado an early 13-6 advantage.

Siebrandt's driving layup helped the Wildcats reduce the deficit to

four points at 19-15, but Morandais followed with a three-point play and McGee with a 3-pointer for a 25-15 lead.

Top seeds advance Down Under

MELBOURNE, Australia (AP)—Serena Williams advanced to the Australian Open third round with a 6-4, 6-0 victory over Belgian Els Callens.

Her potential semifinal opponent, No. 4 Kim Clijsters, advanced with a 6-0, 6-0 victory over Hungary's Petra Mandula. Also, No. 10 Chanda Rubin beat 1995 champion Mary Pierce, and No. 6 Monica Seles fell in three to Czech Klara Koukalova.

No. 9 Andy Roddick overpowered Romania's Adrian Voinea, third-seeded Marat Safin beat France's Albert Montanes, and Czech player Radek Stepanek knocked out three-time French Open champion Gustavo Kuerten.

Kuerten became the 13th casualty among the 32 seeded men. The top 10, however, is missing only No. 5 Carlos Moya, a loser to American Mardy Fish.

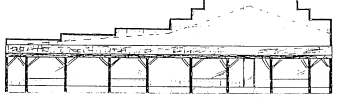
