# Dole Institute set to open this summer

LAWRENCE (AP)—A celebration featuring vintage planes and a reunion of veterans is tentatively planned for this summer when the Robert J. Dole Institute of Politics opens on the University of Kansas' West Campus. The \$10 million, 28,000-square-

foot institute is set to have its grand opening July 20-22. "Things are going well on all fronts," said Richard Norton Smith, the institute's director, who added that all but \$500,000 of the cost has been raised. "We've been very lucky. The weather has really been

on our side." While construction continues, celebrations are being planned for the institute's debut. "Plans for the dedication are going to be very extensive," Norton Smith said. "I think it will sort of blow the roof off Lawrence."
