Information will be available upon request when you ask for a specific individual, unless the patient/resident has requested the information be withheld.

It is important to know that health information is some of the most sacred information we, as individuals, own. Privacy and health information confidentiality will continue to be protected at CMCI.

It has been a pleasure communicating with our community about admissions and dismissals over the years. Following this policy, we will no longer be able to publish or post admission or dismissal information. We understand that this is a surprising change.
