

Dear Friends:

In the summer of 2002, Dr. Eric Jacobsen and Dr. Jeff Kasselman announced they would be leaving Family Center for Health Care and the community. At the same time, Preferred Medical Associates announced their intentions to disaffiliate with the Family Center for Health Care due to the lack of physicians practicing there. The CMCI Board believe it was critical that the 5,000 to 7,000 patients at Family Center have continued access to health care. The revenues generated by the clinic and their patients for CMCI. was also an important factor in this final decision. Thus CMCI purchased the clinic practice. The clinic building was originally built by local investors and then purchased by CMCI in 1993.

The next step that had to be taken was to find physician services. Family Center for Health Care enlisted the services of Docs Who Care (DWC) to fill this physician need permanently or until other permanent physicians could be recruited to the community. Through Docs Who Care, Family Center for Health Care now has a team of four doctors who job-share the physician responsibilities at the Clinic, along with the Family Center for Health Care's existing nurse practitioners.

Colby and the surrounding areas are very fortunate to have the experience and skills available to us through Docs Who Care and Family Center for Health Care. We welcome again, Dr. Ned Nixon, Dr. Scott Russell, Dr. Pauline Aham-Neze and Dr. Stanley Johnson. All four physicians are board certified in family practice and provide obstetrical care. The cost of Docs Who Care is offset by the medical services provided and the revenue these physicians generate through the clinic, ER, lab, diagnostics and the outpatient and inpatient departments of CMCI.

As we have said before, CMCI continues in its efforts to recruit a general surgeon, an anesthesia professional, as well as family practice physicians. We will keep our community apprised as to our progress and success in this area.

We continue to be committed to the health care needs of the northwest Kansas area. We will continue to maintain the best and most comprehensive patient services between Denver and Hays.
