Finally, six national champions competed for schools that took part in this season's tournament.

These results certainly add credpions' claim of being the toughest junior college wrestling tournament in the nation.

Typically, Northwest College Colby led the way with eight All- and Western Wyoming compete at the tournament each year, but unexpectedly failed to take part this year. These schools accounted for six additional All-Americans and one additional national champion tournament this year.
