Royals picked-off by Oakland

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Getting ahead in the count paid off for Mark Mulder.

Mulder held Kansas City to one run in a game that was scoreless until the sixth inning as the Oakland Athletics beat the Royals 6-1 on Thursday night.

"They're a very aggressive team," Mulder said. "You've got to make good pitches early in the count because they can hurt you early."

Eric Byrnes singled leading off the sixth, stretching his career-high hitting streak to 19 games. And the A's went on to take control with a four-run outburst that was more than enough for Mulder (8-2), tied for the AL lead in wins.

Mulder improved to 6-0 against Kansas City, allowing eight hits in seven innings. He lowered his ERA to 2.36, second in the AL to Chicago's Esteban Loaiza (1.96) and pitched at least seven innings for the ninth straight start.

"I just wanted to keep it at zero until we could score some runs," said Mulder, who also beat Royals

rookie starter Kyle Snyder last week in Oakland.

Snyder (0-3) gave up only two hits until Byrnes ignited the four-run sixth. The tallest player in team history, the 6-foot-8 right-hander gave up just six hits and four runs in 5 2-3 innings and has thrown the ball well in five of six starts.

"Snyder's got great stuff. It just seemed like the one inning was his downfall," Mulder said. "But for the most part he did a great job. The Royals have got something there."

Snyder said the A's took advantage of "two bad changeups" in the sixth. "You're going against Mark Mulder and you give up four runs in one inning, you haven't done your job," he said. "This is everyone's ultimate goal, to be at the big league level and win. But we haven't won a game I've started yet. That's disappointing."

Kansas City scored on Angel Berroa's two-out RBI double in the seventh.

"He's such an aggressive hitter, I just wanted to throw a changeup

down there and I didn't care if it was a strike or a ball," Mulder said. "It was a ball, but he just went down and got it."

Oakland has won nine of its last 10 games against the Royals, 2-10 at home since starting the season 11-0 in Kauffman Stadium. The Royals (26-25) have lost four straight and are just 10-22 following a 16-3 start.

"We're going through tough times now," Kansas City manager Tony Pena said. "When a club is not hitting, the pitcher sometimes thinks he has to make a perfect pitch every time. That just makes it harder on him."

Miguel Tejada's RBI double scored Byrnes with the game's first run. Erubiel Durazo's double made it 2-0, then Eric Chavez followed with an RBI single, and Jason Grimsley forced in a run with a bases-loaded walk to No. 9 hitter Chris Singleton.

Chavez hit a run-scoring, double-play grounder in the seventh, and Byrnes had an RBI double in the eighth.

Sports Briefs

BOSTON (AP) — The Red Sox traded All-Star third baseman Shea Hillenbrand to Arizona for Byung-Hyun Kim, cashing in their most tradable player for a former reliever who will join their rotation.

Kim is best known for his Yankee Stadium meltdown in Games 4 and 5 of the 2001 World Series, but has had a solid career with Arizona.

Boston general manager Theo Epstein said the team plans to start Kim next week at Pittsburgh. Manager Grady Little also may use Kim out of the bullpen this weekend in Toronto.

Kim reluctantly filled the closer's role in Arizona after Matt Mantei injured an elbow in 2001 and holds the club record with 70 saves, including a team-record 36 last season. He was 8-3 last year with a 2.04 ERA and 92 strikeouts in 84 innings.

LONDON (AP) — The fight against drugs in sports is in jeopardy because governments are not paying dues on time, the head of the World Anti-Doping Agency said.

WADA chief Dick Pound said the agency may have to cut key anti-drug programs after receiving only 25 percent of its \$20.2 million budget for 2003.

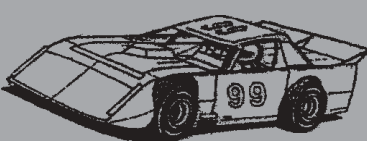
He said the agency was facing a deficit because most governments, including those of the United States, Britain and Japan, had failed to pay.

Pound said he has discussed with IOC president Jacques Rogge possible measures against governments that don't pay. These include denying Olympic accreditations to government officials and refusing to allow the national flag to be flown at opening, closing and medal ceremonies.
