## FBI joins search for missing player

said Sunday it had joined the search for a missing Baylor basketball player, even as fears grew among the athlete's friends that he may not

Patrick James Dennehy, 21, hasn't been heard from in more than two weeks, and police suspect he was killed in the Waco area. His sport utility vehicle, its license plates missing, was found abandoned in a mall parking lot in Vir-

A former roommate and longtime friend in Albuquerque, N.M., Senque Carey, said Dennehy had never been the sort to disappear for days on end without calling someone, or the sort to put himself in

"I just remember Pat as being always to himself. He wasn't like a person who would cause trouble for no reason," said Carey, who played basketball with Dennehy on the University of New Mexico team day afternoon.

WACO, Texas (AP) — The FBI before Dennehy transferred to Baylor his junior year.

John Cunningham, a speech communications professor at the Waco university, said Dennehy was working on an independent study project for his class this summer.

He said Dennehy was a "solid B student" who dreamed of playing for the NBA and then working in public relations for his favorite team, the Sacramento Kings.

'It's been unbelievably hard," Cunningham said Sunday. "Right now, the hardest part is not knowing. We're trying to stay positive, but it's been hard as more time passes." Waco police say Dennehy's teammates and others have been questioned about the disappearance of the 6-foot-10, 230pound center and junior speech communications major from Santa Clara, Calif. Police declined to comment Sunday, saying a news conference was planned for Mon-

#### **National Briefs**

PRAGUE, Czech Republic (AP) Larissa Lazutina was stripped of her remaining medals from the 2002 Olympics due to positive drug tests. The International Olympic Committee executive board Sunday took away two silver medals and wiped out a fourth-place finish after Lazutina lost a series of appeals for her doping suspension. Lazutina, one of the most decorated athletes in Winter Olympics history, had already been stripped of her gold medal in the 30-kilometer classical race after testing positive for the banned endurance-enhancer darbepoetin.

MILWAUKEE (AP) — The Milwaukee Bucks released general manager Ernie Grunfeld from the final year of his contract Sunday, allowing him to immediately pursue other jobs in the NBA. Grunfeld has been rumored as a candidate for president of basketball operations with the Washington Wizards. The Washington Post reported Saturday that Grunfeld could head to Washington as early as Tuesday.

NO SALE TO JORDAN

MILWAUKEE (AP) - Milwaukee Bucks owner Herb Kohl has decided not to sell the team to Michael Jordan. Kohl said Sunday

that he had extensive negotiations with Jordan and was pleased with - Russian cross-country skier Jordan's time and money commitments to a proposed sale, but that he didn't want to part with the team right now. Previously, Kohl had said he was willing to sell the team he bought for \$18 million in 1985, with the stipulation that any new owner must agree to keep the team in Milwaukee.
