The season pass is the only way to go. You save \$80 on a single pass and your family saves even more. Our ticket prices at the gate this season are \$7 for adults and \$3 for students (over age 6). If you were to take in all 20 home events (6 volleyball and 14 basketball) you would pay \$140 per adult and \$60 for each child. It makes good sense to get a season pass and save. A family of four (2 adults and 2 children) would save \$280 by getting a family pass.

There have been a few complaints about our school raising ticket prices. We are currently in line with the other conference schools when it comes to pricing tickets. For example at Barton County a chair back seat will cost years 24-6 not bad. We have 14 you \$7 at the gate and \$5 for a student. In Hutchinson tickets at the gate are \$7.
