Tennis girls now preparing for the regional action

As a team, Colby took first overall, "a great way to close the regular season and begin regionals on Monday at Larned," she said.

• Katie Lang, #1 singles, 4-0. Never let an opponent get more than one game on her. Played very consistent at baseline and tough to beat when at the net. Katie smoked a Liberal player during the first round to take home a first-place medal.

• Rachel Funk, #2 singles, 2-1 on the day. Overpowered her opponents in the first two matches and came up with a familiar Liberal opponent and lost a hard fought match. Rachel has played up to all of her opponents' level this year and improved tremendously since the beginning of the season. For Rachel's hard work Thursday, she received a secondplace medal.

• Crystal Mannebach and Becky Lang, #1 doubles, went 4-0. They started out pretty rocky, but picked up the pace as the day progressed. Sixth graders lose to Victoria by 8

The Colby 6th grade football Eagles were on the road for the 3rd consecutive week on Sunday. They traveled to Victoria to take on the Huskers, suffering a 28-20 loss..

Colby received the opening kick and marched right down the field to put a touchdown on the board with 5:04 left in the first quarter. Adam Weber bulled his way across the goal line to put the Eagles up 6-0, as the extra point attempt failed.

Victoria answered right back with a score of their own with 2:02 on the clock. Their extra point was good and they led 7-6. The lead didn't last long however, as Preston Kryzcki took the ensuing kickoff back 75 yards for the Eagles 2nd touchdown of the opening quarter. Kryzcki also carried in the extra point to make it 13-7 Colby.

Victoria again answered with their offense when they scored on a 10-yard pass with 6:13 left in the 2nd quarter. The point-after attempt was good and the Huskers were back on top, 14-13.

What was turning out to be a wild first half continued with the Eagles next possession when Jordon Voss broke through right up the middle for a 60-yard touchdown run. Kryzcki again tacked on the extra yards and a TD. Kalen Rasmussen

However, Victoria wasn't done scoring in the half yet until they completed a halfback pass for a 35yard touchdown with :52 left, and then converted the extra point for a 21-20 lead at half-time.

Just as Colby had done last week against Hays, Victoria took the second half kickoff and began a long, time consuming drive that ended with a touchdown with only:20 left in the 3rd quarter. The Eagles were only able to run five plays until they had to turn it over on downs. Victoria then took control of the game and kept the ball on the ground until time ran out. After a wide open 1st half, the 2nd half saw only one score by the Huskers, but it was enough as the game ended with a 28-20 score.

Assistant Coach Tracy Rogers said, "We just weren't able to make the stops when we needed them. We were able to score with our offense, but couldn't get the ball back when we needed to."

Voss led the offense with 96 yards rushing and 1 TD. Krzycki followed him with 58 yards rushing, 80 yards in returns and 1 TD. Weber had 29

point to make the score 20-14 also had 30 yards on kick returns. Defensively, Kirt Dugger led the team with 13 tackles, followed closely by Ethan Stickel with 12. Brandon Gordon and Chas Winger both had 8 stops, Kalen Rasmussen had 7, Torey Taylor 6. Nathan Reed, Brandon Kraus, Garrett Rogers, Jacob Hutfles, and Voss all had 3 tackles each, followed by Weber, and Tyler Bates with 2, Krzycki and Dylan Stithem with one.




