

# Trojan men, women win S&T/Ambassador Classic

## Men are now at 7-0

The Colby Community College men's basketball team ran its unbeaten streak to seven with three wins this past weekend at the S&T Communications/Ambassador Classic, in the Colby Community Building.

Colby jumped out to a 50-24 lead at half-time and never looked back downing Central Nebraska 50-24 on Thursday night. Justin Williams was just the third player in school history to record a triple double when he scored 25 points, grabbed 10 rebounds and swatted 10 shots. Williams joins EJ Drayton and Larry House as the only players in Colby history with a triple double.

Dillion Sneed came off the bench to score 19 points and grab 13 rebounds. Drayton added 18 while Brandon Miller and Sam Jackson were also in double figures with 10.

On Friday, Colby defeated South Plains (Texas) 72-52 in a highly anticipated match-up of top 15

ranked pre-season teams. The #7 Trojans and #13 Texans were tied five times in the first 11 minutes of the contest before Colby went on a 9-0 run to lead 30-21. South Plains closed the gap to seven on one occasion later in the first half, but couldn't get closer than nine in the second half as the Trojans pulled away for the victory.

Drayton led Colby with 24 points and 7 rebounds. Despite playing only 4 minutes in the first half because of having two fouls, Justin Williams added 9 points, 10 rebounds and 6 blocks. Brandon Miller added 13 points, while 5'11" freshman Ontario McKee added 9 points, 6 assists and 5 rebounds.

Colby came out of the gate Saturday very slow and trailed New Mexico 29-16 with 11 minutes to go in the first half, but responded with a 25-9 run to end the half.

The Trojans continued the run as they opened the second half with a

31-12 run to lead by 22 with just over 10 minutes to play.

The Trojans defeated New Mexico 89-75 for their seventh consecutive victory to open the season.

McKee led Colby with a career high 20 points and a career high 10 assists. He also added 6 rebounds. Drayton added 20 points, 6 rebounds and 6 assists, while Miller netted 19.

Justin Williams was also in double figures with 17. Colby out-rebounded New Mexico 39-23 and shot 56.4 percent from the field.

Forward EJ Drayton, 6'8", was named MVP of the Classic. The Complete All-Tournament Team is listed below:

## Ladies improve record to 5-1

The Colby Community College Lady Trojan basketball team ran its record to 5-1 with three wins this past weekend in the S&T Communications/Ambassador Classic at the Colby Community Building.

On Thursday, the Lady Trojans opened the Classic with a 89-51 victory over Miles City. Mont. Colby opened the game with an impressive 26-2 run and hit 50.8 percent of their field goals.

Sophomore Louise McLain led the Colby attack with a triple-double scoring 10 points, grabbing 13 rebounds and dishing out 10 assists.

Bojana Samardziska had 11 points and 10 rebounds, while Jayci Stone (18), Jelena Spiric (17) and Ivana Dramac (14) scored in double figures. Colby out-rebounded Miles City 51-37 and held them to 28.4 percent shooting.

Colby held #5 ranked Western Nebraska to 37.5 percent shooting

on Friday to win 73-59. The Lady Trojans gained a 16-15 lead with just over 8 minutes left in the first half and never trailed again.

Samardziska led Colby with a dominating performance inside netting 24 points and grabbing 13 rebounds. Louise McLain contributed 17 points and 7 assists. Dramac and Spiric were also in double figures with 13 and 11, respectively. Colby hit 12 of 14 free throws and hit 9 three-point shots in the victory.

The Lady Trojans began Saturday's final game very sluggish against Independence and trailed 42-23 at the break. However, Colby's inspired second half rally began with a 24-6 run over the first nine minutes of the second frame. Jelena Spiric made two free throws with 4.3 seconds on the clock to give the Lady Trojans the 70-69 victory. An arant 3-point shot came up short as time expired for Independence.

Spiric scored 25 points and added

9 rebounds in leading the Lady Trojans to their fourth consecutive victory overall. Dramac had 19 points and Samardziska added 16 in the win. Colby shot just 41.9 percent from the floor, but converted 12 of 16 free throws in the 70-69 win.

Colby is now 5-1 on the season. They will travel to Colorado Springs for the Air Force Prep Tournament next weekend. They will play three games beginning Friday and ending Sunday.

## Three named to All-tourney team

The Colby Community College Lady Trojans completed a three-game sweep hosting the S&T Communications/Ambassador Classic, and three Trojans were named to the All-Tournament Team announced Sunday.

Sophomore Jelena Spiric, 6'1" (Belgrade, Yugoslavia) was named the Most Valuable Player of the Tournament. Spiric led the tournament in scoring averaging 17.7 per game. She also averaged 5.3 rebounds and had 12 steals in the three tournament games. Sophomore Louise McLain, 5'10" (Warrnambool, Australia) and 6'4" sophomore Bojana Samardziska (Belgrade, Yugoslavia) were

named to the All-Tournament team. McLain averaged 11.0 points, 9.0 assists and 6.7 rebounds while Samardziska netted 17.0 points and 9.3 rebounds per contest.

Independence had two members on the All-Tournament team in Dacie Reutlinger and Tiffany Jones. Western Nebraska placed one member on the squad with Tatiana

Conceicao earning the honor.

## Ouch! Chiefs lose

CINCINNATI (AP) — The upset was boldly predicted. The upshot was highly preposterous.

The Cincinnati Bengals are in first place. By taking down the NFL's last undefeated team, the league's worst team finally shed its reputation — everywhere but in the Kansas City Chiefs' locker room, that is.

A 24-19 victory on Sunday emphatically ended the Chiefs' run of perfection and the Bengals' run of ineptitude. There's no question about which result was more shocking.

"Nobody in the world thought we'd be at this point right now," Bengals offensive tackle Willie Anderson said.

The Bengals (5-5) are a contender for the first time since 1990, the last time they had a winning record and made the playoffs. They moved into a first-place tie with Baltimore atop the AFC North, the only division without a winning team.


And they did it at the expense of the league's premier team. Peter Warrick's 68-yard punt return and 77-yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter left the Chiefs (9-1) stewing.
