His unsportsmanlike conduct penalty for taking off his helmet after a long punt return forced Oakland to settle for a tying field goal late in the fourth quarter Sunday and enabled the Chiefs to win 27-24 on Morten Andersen's 35-yard field goal with 4 seconds left.

The loss dropped the defending AFC champions to 3-8, while the Chiefs (10-1) can clinch the AFC West title next week if they beat San Diego and Denver loses to Oakland. Andersen's game-winning kick - the 35th of his career — was set up by Marc Boerigter's 16-yard catch on fourth-and-14 when Buchanon didn't cover the Chiefs' wide receiver close enough.

Buchanon, whose muffed punt led to a Chiefs touchdown in Kansas City's 17-10 win in October, had little to say about either of his mistakes.

"It was a tough game to lose. I didn't do enough for us to win," he said with a shrug. "That's how it happens."
