Ingalls was a two-time state finalist and a former state champion in the South Dakota high school ranks and represented the Cornhuskers in the 2003 Big 12 Championships. Luedke won this battle with a hard fought 3-1 victory over a very talented competitor. In the championship bout. Luedke lost a tightly contested 2-1 decision to Travis Peak of Chadron State College. Peak, a senior at Chadron, has been a varsity letter winner in each of his first three seasons with the Eagles and placed second at last weekend's FHSU Open when he lost by just a point to

States Hendricks.

The performance at Kearney allowed Luedke to run his record to 19-4 on the year. Included in this total is a 4-1 record versus junior college competition. This success has earned Luedke the rating as the nation's 4th best junior college wrestler at 157 pounds. Those same rankings, which were released on Dec 12, list Colby as the 7th ranked junior college team in the nation. Trojan standouts and returning NJCAA national champions Muzaffar Abdurakhmanov and C.B. Dollaway continue to hold

down top billing at their respective weight divisions.

The next action for the Trojans will be a Jan. 7 meeting with Lincoln College. The dual will be held at Hoxie High School. That will be a busy week for the Trojan wrestlers, as they will host their annual Tournament of Champions on Friday, Jan. 9 and 10th and will square off against in-state rival and nationally ranked Neosho County Community College on Jan. 11. The Tournament of Champions and the Neosho dual will each be held in the Colby Community Building.


