Peale and Paul

Attitudes; simply defined, your attitude is the disposition you choose to wear as you face everyday life. The late Norman Vincent Peale wrote a tremendous book entitled "The Power of Positive Thinking". He wasn't the first to address this topic; The Apostle Paul wrote in the first century, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.."- Philippians 4:4-8 (NIV)

Principle #1 - Attitudes have the power to shape and mold events! Most people assume that events shape attitudes; but actually, the opposite can be true. There is tremendous power in attitudes - negative or positive! Attitudes are like muscles; left unflexed, attitudes conform to the pressures of people and circumstances around them. But when flexed, attitudes have the power to shape and mold people and circumstances around you. A famous man once said... "Whether you think you can, or whether you think you can't, you're probably right."

Principle #2 - Attitude determines Altitude! A positive mental attitude has tremendous power! "Attitude determines altitude." A positive attitude attracts people, circumstances and events to move your way. A person does not have a great attitude because he has a high position; he has the high position because he has a great attitude! There's a magic in an enthusiastic attitude toward life. Bill Gaither wrote a song that says, "I Just Feel Like Something Good is about to Happen!"

A little boy was overheard talking to himself as he strutted through the backyard, baseball cap in place, toting ball and bat. He was heard to say "I'm the greatest hitter in the world." Then he tossed the ball into the air, swung at it and missed. "Strike One!" Undaunted he picked up the ball, threw it into the air and said to himself, "I'm the greatest baseball hitter ever," and he swung at the ball again. And again he missed. "Strike two!" He paused a moment to examine his bat and ball carefully. Then a third time he threw the ball into the air. "I'm the greatest hitter who ever lived," he said. He swung the bat hard again, missed the third time. He cried out," Wow! Strike three! What a pitcher! I'm the greatest pitcher in the world!" That's a bit exaggerated — but that's the attitude!
