"Consider now: Who, being innocent, has ever perished? Where were the upright ever destroyed?" Job 4:7

These words were from Eliphaz the Temanite in response to Job's affliction. It was his contention that only sinners suffered, therefore Job must be suffering for his sins.

While the overall context is correct. God always protects His people; the application leaves much to be desired. Eliphaz, however, is not alone in making such an application.

God's providence and His allowance for hardships upon His people have confused many. It is trite and perhaps more than a little insensitive to attempt to console a grieving parent for the loss of a child by saying, "It was God's will."

Did God will it, at least by permission? Yes. Does it serve a purpose? The answer would again be yes.

Is the death of a loved one: or some other such catastrophe God's direct punishment for sin? Probably not. For one thing, God doesn't work that way.

God allows us to be tried and proven again and again. Each time we are made a little stronger and more complete by the things we endure. The Apostle Paul endured many trials and punishments not for his crimes, but because he preached the Gospel faithfully.

In the same way, we also may be called to endure hardship and privation for the privilege of sharing the message of hope with the

Conversely, we can also understand that God is not obligated to protect us from the direct consequences of sin. No, it isn't God's "punishment" per se, but it has the same effect. If we live in rebellion to God's wisdom and suffer the conse-

quences, we have no one to blame but ourselves.

Ultimately, God's protection and provision are found in the home we are promised with Him for all eternity.

Kind of makes it all worth it, doesn't it.
