Eagle wrestlers finish fourth at tough Beloit tournament

The Colby Eagles came home with a fourth-place finish from last weekend's 20-school Beloit Wrestling Tournament, and in the process six Eagles earned placings during the two-day affair. Colby scored 129 team points.

Hoxie and Manhattan tied for first with 175.5 points, while Abilene placed third with 138. Hoxie and Manhattan are ranked #1 in 3-2-1A and 6A, respectively, in the state; Colby is ranked #5 in 4A; and Abilene is ranked #1 in 4A.
