## Matt Murray in super showing at nationals

Matthew Murray, known far and finals against Cliff Moore of the talent — many fans will remember his skills on the local mats — came away from the NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships on March 18-20 in St. Louis in the runner-up spot.

Murray is a member of the University of Nebraska Cornhusker team. Murray entered the national showdown ranked #7 in the nation. After winning his first two matches, he met the #2-ranked wrestler in the country, Nate Gallick of Iowa State, in the quarterfinals. Murray won the match 3-3 by overtime criteria (riding time). Gallick had defeated Murray twice previously in close encounters.

In the semifinals, Murray had to meet the #3-ranked wrestler and returning 2003 national champion, Teyon Ware of the University of Oklahoma. Murray was able to take this match by a 5-4 decision.

wide for his exceptional wrestling University of Iowa. In the semis, Cliff Moore defeated the #1-ranked wrestler, Scott Moore of the University of Virginia. Scott Moore had entered the tourney with a 48-0 record, with 33 of those victories being pins.

Murray came up short against Cliff Moore, 2-5. Since Cliff Moore is a senior, Murray will likely enter the 2004-05 wrestling season ranked #1 in the country.

Murray was also selected to the 1st Team Big XII All-Academic Team, with a 3.9 grade point average. After placing 2nd at the national tourney, Murray was selected to the 1st Team All-American Academic Team.


