Eagle golfers get first taste of new season

The Colby High School Eagle golf team competed in the recent Norton invitational and placed 9th, carding a 423.

Although none of the Colby participants medaled, R.J. Landerburger toured the course with a 90, to lead all Eagle players.

Norton came in first with a 339; Goodland was second at 356; Hill City, third, 365; Oakley, fourth, 367; Hoxie, fifth, 371; Smith Cen-

ter, sixth, 381; Stockton, seventh, 396; Norton-B, eighth, 400; Colby, ninth, 423; Victoria, 10th, 427; Quinter, 11th, 429; and Phillipsburg, 12th, 442.

Top individual medalist was Dan Krizek of Norton who shot a 78. Carl Dumler, Oakley, was second with an 80 and Jeff Cameron of Hoxie was third with an 83.

Two Goodland golfers were also among the medalists, Nathan Linin

with an 83 and Ian Scherling with an 85.
