Trojans drop two

Wednesday's meeting against Barton County went differently than the season's earlier meeting, which the Colby Trojans swept. This time the Cougars could do no wrong in winning both ends of the double-header, 14-2 and 9-1.

Game one got out of hand early as Barton took a 3-0 lead in the first and never looked back. The Trojans managed two runs in the fifth on a two-run Cole Armstrong double. The sophomore shortstop was 2 for 3 in game one.

Game two looked good for a while, as the Trojans held a 1-0 lead going into the bottom of the third, before a two-run Cougar home run gave them a lead they would not relinquish. The score was only 2-1 going into the bottom of the fifth, when Barton exploded for seven runs to put the game out of reach.

Freshman outfielder Mike Neuberg went 2 for 3 with a double and an RBI in game two. Sophomore catcher Kyle Sandusky scored Neuberg in the second with a single to give the Trojans their early lead. Sophomore outfielder Joel Gould also added a double.
