Very young children will react more so to the obvious changes, such as a parent's continuing absence or a move to another location.

Older children who have a more mature concept of the issues will have reactions related to their personal sense of loyalty and fairness.

Parents should be alert to signs of distress in their children. Young children tend to react with behavior changes such as angry outbursts. being uncooperative or withdraw-

Older children will experience vorce can be very beneficial for all more of the sense of loss and feelings of sadness; their schoolwork may suffer, or they, too, may exhibit some behavior changes.

When things settle down and life is back to a sense of normalcy, such behaviors should diminish.



ORDINANCE NO. 1363

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING WILLOW WITHIN THE CITY OF COLBY, KANSAS, AS A MAIN TRAFFICWAY.

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 12-685 (the "Act") provides that the governing body of any city is authorized and empowered to designate and establish, by ordinance, as a main trafficway, any existing or proposed street, boulevard, avenue or part thereof, within such city, the primary function of which is, or shall be, the movement of through traffic between areas of concentrated activity within the city or between such areas within the city and traffic facilities outside the city performing the function of a major trafficway and such designation by the City Council shall be final and conclusive; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Colby, Kansas (the "City"), hereby finds and determines that a certain street within the City should be designated and established as a main trafficway as provided by and under the authority of the Act.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY SECTION 1. Designation. It is hereby authorized, ordered and directed that

Willow is located in the City and is hereby designated and established as a main trafficway within the City, the primary function of which is the movement of through traffic within the City, under the authority of the Act.

### Kansas turnpike plans to raise toll next month

TOPEKA (AP) — Tolls on the Kansas Turnpike will increase an average of 5 percent on Aug. 1 to help finance improvements along the 236-mile road, officials said.

The Turnpike Authority announced the increases Wednesday, saying they will raise an additional \$3.5 million annually.

The toll for cars, pickups and vans from the turnpike's east Topeka exit to the west Lawrence exit will increase to 85 cents from 80 cents; from the south Topeka exit to the turnpike's eastern terminal in Wyandotte County, to \$2.25 from \$2.10, and from south Topeka to the

east Wichita exit, to \$5 from \$4.75. For motorists driving the full length of the road — from Kansas City, Kan., west to Topeka, then southwest to Wichita and south to the Oklahoma border — the toll will increase to \$8.75 from \$8.15.

The turnpike authority receives no general tax dollars and relies on tolls to finance its operations. Its five-member board includes two legislators, the Kansas secretary of transportation and two gubernatorial appointees.

Turnpike officials said the additional revenue will help pay for adding a new lane in each direction on the 13-mile stretch between east Topeka and Lecompton, a \$92.3 million project.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1347, 2003 STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, OF THE CITY OF COLBY, KANSAS, TO PROVIDE RESTRICTIONS FOR USE OF CITY SIDEWALKS OR PEDESTRIAN WALKWAYS IN THE DOWNTOWN

WHEREAS, the City of Colby adopted the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities", Edition of 2003, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities; said document adopted by Ordinance No. 1347, dated

BUSINESS DISTRICT AND OTHER AREAS SO DESIGNATED.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body may amend said Standard Traffic Ordinance with additional provisions for local regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body wishes to provide regulations for the use of bicycles, roller skates, skateboards, coasters, toy vehicles, or similar devices on sidewalks or pedestrian walkways in the downtown business district and other areas so designated by the Governing Body.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF COLBY, KANSAS:

Section 1: Section 136, Use of Coasters, Roller Skates and Similar Devices Restricted, of the 2003 Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be amended to read

No person upon roller skates, or riding in or by means of any coaster, toy

vehicle, or similar device, shall go upon any roadway except while crossing a

Sixth Street between Chickamauga Avenue and Lake Avenue, and other areas

street at a crosswalk and except upon streets set aside as play streets. Ref: Sec. 20. Play Streets In addition, no person riding a bicycle or upon roller skates, skateboards, coasters, toy vehicles or similar devices shall go upon sidewalks or pedestrian walkways in the downtown business district, more specifically designated as sidewalks or pedestrian walkways bounded by an area from Second Street to

Section 2: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval, and publication one time in the Colby Free Press
