## Eagle football camp dates released

High school boys planning to participate in football this coming fall are invited to take part in the Colby Eagles 2004 summer football camp from July 19-22 from 6-8 p.m. each day. Middle school boys are invited to attend as spectators and parents and other fans are also welcome to attend as spectators, said Greg Koenig, head football coach.

Questions expected to be asked most frequently about the camp (and answers), include:

• **Where.** Colby High School practice fields.

• **What.** The camp will be four evenings of individual and group instruction in the **double wing of-**

fense and the **twin tilt defense** as well as some fun activities. **Players are not required to attend**, but attending the camp will give you a big advantage when practice starts in the fall as you will have a basic understanding of the offensive and defensive packages that will be installed.

• **What to bring.** Participants should wear **athletic shorts, T-shirts and football cleats.** You may bring a water bottle and insect repellent. You should not bring items of value (e.g. walkman, money, etc.).

• **Coaching staff.** Coach Koenig, head coach; coach Vincent, defensive coordinator; and possibly other Colby High School coaches.

• **Cost.** There will be no registration fee for the camp. **Colby High School football players may attend free of charge.**

• **Note.** While this is a non-contact camp, participants will be involved in various athletic activities. **Any injuries that occur should be reported to a coach immediately.** The coaching staff will not be held responsible for any injuries that occur. Also, all campers will be expected to display positive, enthusiastic attitudes at all times. Disruptive and non-compliant behavior will not be tolerated and may lead to dismissal from the camp.

## Athletic training camp scheduled

Colby students interested in learning more about sports medicine are encouraged to attend an athletic training camp in Garden City from Monday, July 26 through Thursday, July 29.

The camp is being co-sponsored by Sandhill Orthopedic and Sportsmedicine and Garden City Community College, said Mandy German, marketing director at the orthopedic office.

"Since Colby High School and Sandhill Orthopedic have a working relationship with athletes, students in Colby can attend the camp free," she said.

The camp is made free to Colby students, said Jeff Quenzer, activities director and assistant principal at Colby High School, through the \$10 donations collected each spring for physicals from the Family Center for Healthcare.

Students will gain knowledge on emergency management, preventa-

tive taping and treatment, along with rehabilitation of common athletic injuries, German said.

"The camp, which is open to all high school and college students, includes lectures, demonstrations and hands-on laboratory experiences," she said.

The camp was started 17 years ago by Steve Barrett, head athletic trainer at Garden City Community College with Sandhill Orthopedic sponsoring.

"This camp is so beneficial to the students and helps them learn techniques and knowledge they can use in their high school or college," Barrett said.

In return, he said, we gain valu-

able watch dogs who interact with our athletes everyday.

For those students interested in a physical therapy or athletic training career, this camp is a great opportunity as well, he said.

"You don't have to want to become a certified athletic trainer to come to the camp either — you could just be a curious athlete," he said.

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Jason Jennings feels right at home in Petco Park.

Jennings dominated the San Diego Padres for the second time this season at their new downtown ballpark, combining with two relievers on a five-hitter in the Colorado Rockies' 5-1 victory Thursday night.

Jennings (8-7) allowed one run on five hits in 7-2-3 innings with five strikeouts and one walk.

The right-hander gave up only one hit and did not allow a

baserunner to reach second base through six innings before Brian Giles hit a leadoff homer in the seventh.

In his other outing at Petco Park, a 7-1 win on May 31, Jennings allowed one run and four hits in eight innings.
