Atwood's Horinek among honored All-Stars

EMPORIA — Football fans watching the Kansas Shrine Bowl, either in person at Welch Stadium in Emporia on July 31 or on a state-wide Public Television network, will see more than 68 of the best high school football players in the state. They will be seeing many individual players who are already making their marks beyond the boundaries of the football field.

Jeff Horinek of Atwood, for ex-

ample, earned honors by graduating with a 4.0 grade point average. Luke Sims of Salina South, earned a 3.8 grade point average.

“When we choose players for the Shrine Bowl, we look at more than just their football skills and accomplishments,” says Dave Mize, executive director of the Kansas Shrine Bowl. “We’re looking for good citizens, players who not only play football well, but who are do-

ing well in non-football areas of life, such as in the classroom or in their communities.”

From information submitted by the players, it is evident the Class of 2004 brings a wealth of academic talent, school involvement, and community service to their schools and local communities.

Fifteen have been accepted into the National Honor Society, a national organization that honors those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of scholarship, leadership, service, and character.

Religious activities are a big part of many Shrine Bowl players' lives. More than 30 players listed some kind of involvement in church or religious organizations, including participation in church youth groups, choirs, and membership in Catholic Youth Organization Chapters and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

Two West players, Brett Alstatt (Hays) and Tony Lewis (Ulysses), have earned Eagle Scout status. Three West players have participated in annual Kansas American Legion Boy's State, which brings

students together for an interactive “learning by doing” forum about state and local government, including Garrett Gretz (Great Bend), Zack Carbiener (Wichita Northwest), and Kale Klatt (Scott Community).

Many have been active within their schools by holding offices either in the Student Council or being a class officer.

Several players are active in their communities as volunteers, much of it centering on young people, including coaching, officiating, and assisting with summer camps.

The 2004 game will kickoff at Welch Stadium at Emporia State on Saturday, July 31 at 7 p.m. Reserved chairback tickets are \$20 in advance, \$22.00 on game night. Adult general admission tickets are \$9 in advance, \$10 on game night. Student tickets are \$5 in advance, \$6 on game night. Bryant case ruling draws praise from the prosecutors

DENVER (AP)—Prosecutors in the Kobe Bryant case will be able to present key pieces of evidence at the NBA star's trial on sexual assault charges next month.

On Wednesday, a judge refused a defense request to throw out a 75-minute interview of Bryant by detectives and evidence including a T-shirt stained with the alleged victim's blood.

Bryant's attorneys said the material was gathered while he was illegally in custody, but the judge disagreed.

District Judge Terry Ruckriegle said Bryant cooperated with detectives until they said they wanted him to undergo a medical examination. He threw out the results of that exam because the detectives didn't have the proper court order to take him to a hospital in the middle of the night.

Despite the loss of that evidence, prosecutors praised the ruling.

“We're pleased with the ruling and we consider it an important ruling,” prosecution spokeswoman Krista Flannigan said.

After-hours calls left with the Denver-based defense team were not immediately returned.

Bryant has pleaded not guilty to felony sexual assault and faces an Aug. 27 trial. He has said he had consensual sex with an employee, now 20, at the Vail-area resort where she worked last summer.

If convicted, Bryant faces four years to life in prison or 20 years to life on probation, and a fine of up to \$750,000.

Bryant's attorneys have long criticized the Eagle County sheriff's office, saying investigators improperly questioned Mr. Bryant.
