Aug. 3-7 is the Thomas County Fair with rodeos, barbecue, car races, demolition derby and lots of fun.

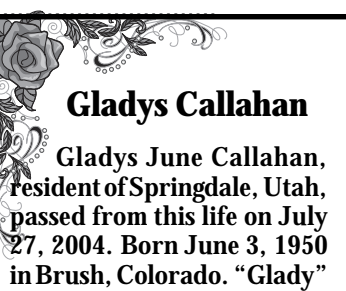
