# Toughest penalty yet in hunting case

LAKEWOOD, Colo. — Cooperation among Kansas citizens, and law enforcement officers from the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service recently resulted in a federal indictment of rancher Dwight Krebs of Scott City, and his employee, Jim Jenkins, for violations of the Airborne Hunting Act, and the Lacy Act, as well as state

On Nov. 23, Krebs was sentenced to three years supervised probation, including no hunting in the United States and no possession of firearms for three years, and payment of \$15,000 restitution to Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks.
