To qualify for an SBC Excelerator grant, an organization's major focus and project must emphasize education, community development, health and human services, or

Grant funds will be applied toward data communications services, hardware, software, technology training, personnel, and application development.

Grants range from \$2,500 to \$25,000 and are one year in length. Collaborations by two or more organizations were considered for grants up to \$50,000. The SBC Excelerator program is

the largest special grants program ever undertaken by the SBC Foundation, one of the top corporate foundations in the nation, according to The Foundation Center.
