

Brewster receives honor

The Kansas State High School Activities Association, through its member schools, defines sportsmanship as “those qualities of behavior which are characterized by generosity and genuine concern for others.”

It further states that “awareness is expected of the impact of an individual’s influence on others’ behavior as well.”

Citizenship/Sportsmanship Rule 52 addresses this challenge by stating: “Win with character and lose with dignity.”

Enter: Brewster High School. The school received a certificate of sportsmanship for Class 1A Girls at the state tournament at Gross Memorial Coliseum at Fort Hays State University on March 9-12.

A special sportsmanship committee appointed by the association evaluated and rated the cheerleaders, school cheering section, adult and non-high school followers, team and coach of each school to determine winners.

Schools whose teams did not advance to the semifinals rounds were eligible to receive a certificate if they met the qualifying standards of sportsmanship, while schools participating all three days of the tourney were eligible to receive a plaque for their school and medals for the cheerleaders.

The Brewster girls lost in the opening round of state to Wetmore, 39-38.

As Rule 52 says, “Win with character and lose with dignity.” Brewster did just that. - td

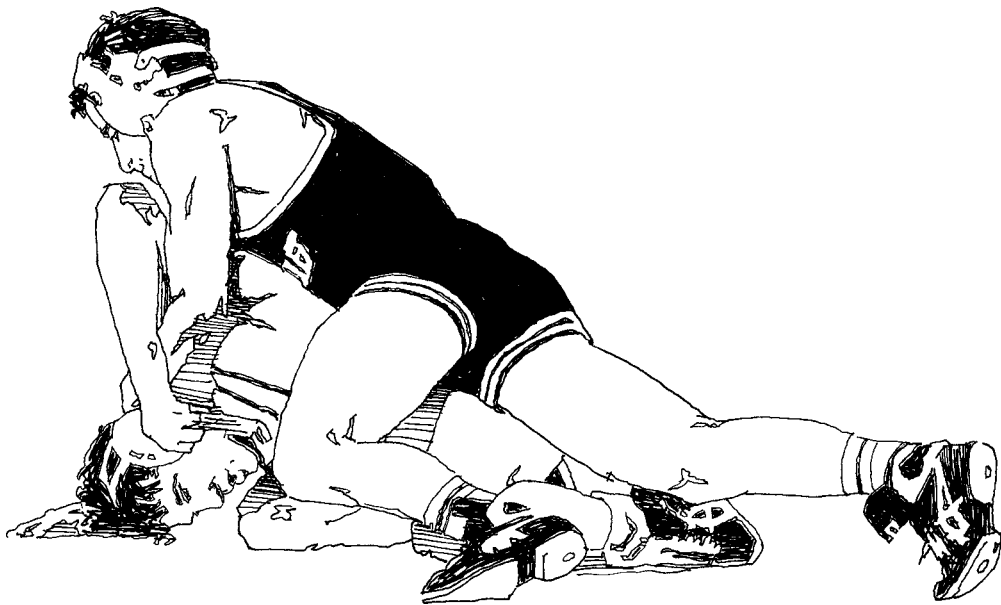
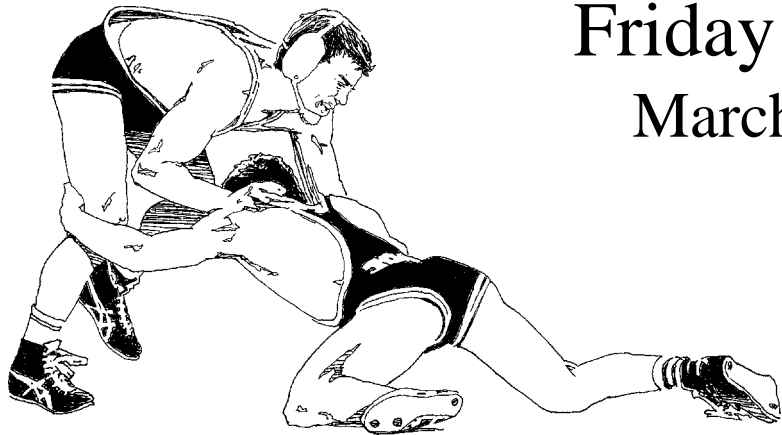
