# Colby Heat cashes in on more wins

The Colby Heat 12-U boys hosted a triangular with Norton and Goodland. on June 17. Sam Kendrick took the mound for Norton's game and Adam Weber threw against Goodland. Both pitchers had nine strikeouts and one walk each. Final score was 5-4, Colby over Norton and 10-6, Colby over Goodland. Norton took home a win in the second game against Goodland. All three teams were evenly matched, as they held each other scoreless for two to three innings each game. Paul Schiferl was the "man of the hour" in both games when he came through with double RBIs after two outs and scores were needed.

The Heat again saw action on June 20 at home with Quinter, then traveled to WaKeeney on June 21. Monday night's (June 20) double header gave Kale Arnberger three innings of pitching and Jordan Rasmussen the fourth. Colby held Quinter scoreless in all but the last inning when two runs were allowed. Kendrick also had a nice three run homer to start scoring in the third inning after two outs were on the board. Final score was 12-2, Colby.

The second game of the evening gave Konner Kriss, Dalton Snyder and Paul Schiferl time at the mound. Each pitcher saw two strikeouts in each of the innings pitched except the first, when fielded pop flies sent Quinter back to the dugout with no runners on bases. Another merit play was a run down batter between 1st baseman Quagliano and pitcher Snyder covering second base, which made the first out, then two strikeouts followed, allowing only one run that inning for Quinter. Final score was 5-2, Colby. RBIs and hits were: 1st game: Rasmussen, 1 hit, 2 runs; Cox, 1 bunt, 1 run; Arnberger, 1 hit, 2 runs; Weber, 1 hit, 2 runs; Kendrick, 1 hit, 1 homer, 4 RBIs; Flanagan, 2 hits, 2 runs; Sager, 2 hits, 2 RBIs, 1 run; Kriss, 1 stolen run; Snyder, 2 walks, no runs due to run rule; Schiferl, 1 hit & RBI.

2nd game: Cox, 2 hits, 2 runs; Snyder, 1 hit & RBI; Sager, 1 stolen run; Flanagan, 1 hit, 1 triple & RBI, 2 runs; Kriss, 1 hit & RBI, 1 run; Quagliano, 1 bunt hit; Bear, 1 RBI sacrifice.

Tuesday's (June 21) first game with WaKeeney's Lions saw Sam Kendrick back at pitcher as he threw a no-score game until the fifth inning, when one run was allowed. Kendrick threw six strikeouts and two walks, and the Heat crew fielded many grounders and pop flies well. Final score was 8-1, Colby. The team as a whole is becoming more confident about pick offs when batters are allowed on bases, and pop flies were showcased by shortstop Jordan Rasmussen and right fielder Dalton Snyder.

Taylor Moeder, Paul Schiferl, and Luke Cox all shared the mound for the second game. The younger team run ruled the Lions each inning and ended their fourth and final inning when Schiferl RBI'd more runners than could be allowed. Final score was 20-4, Colby. The Lions remained scoreless until an RBI sac by Hunter Scheib got their only runner on base to score. Three additional runs were scored during the final inning.
