## Briefs

### •Football

BEREA, Ohio (AP) — Rookie wide receiver Braylon Edwards agreed to terms on a five-year contract with the Cleveland Browns, ending his holdout.

Edwards, the No. 3 overall pick, will sign his contract on Thursday and practice with the Browns for the first time, a person within the league told the Associated Press on the condition of anonymity.

The source asked to remain unidentified due to the sensitivity of the negotiations between the Browns and agent Lamont Smith.

### •Baseball

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Philadelphia Phillies first baseman Jim Thome is expected to have season-ending surgery on his right elbow next week.

The four-time All-Star was placed on the 15-day disabled list July 1, his second stint on the DL

this season. He hit .207 with seven homers and 30 RBIs in 59 games this year.

BOSTON (AP) — Rushed into the rotation when his suspension for shoving two cameramen was cut from 20 games to 13, Kenny Rogers gave up Manny Ramirez's long home run in a five-run fourth inning and the Boston Red Sox scored nine more off the bullpen in the eighth to beat the Texas Rangers 16-5.

Rogers was suspended 20 games by commissioner Bud Selig for a June 29 tirade in which he shoved two cameramen.

On Tuesday, an arbitrator trimmed the punishment to 13 games and Rogers joined the Rangers in Boston to get ready for his first start since July 26.

### •Track and Field

HELSINKI, Finland (AP) — Americans Bryan Clay and Tianna Madison were triumphant on a cold,

wet and windy night at the world track and field championships.

Clay, at 5-foot-11 dwarfed by his mammoth opponents, defeated Olympic champion and world record holder Roman Sebrle of the Czech Republic, 8,732 points to 8,521, to win the gold medal in the decathlon, 10 events completed in awful weather over two days.

Madison, a 19-year-old junior-to-be at Tennessee, soared to a personal-best 22-7 1/4 on her next-to-last attempt to win the women's long jump.

Olympic bronze medalist Tatyana Kotova was second at 22-3 1/2. Eunice Barber of France, heptathlon silver medalist in Helsinki, was third with a wind-aided 22-2 1/4.

The two victories, and Sanya Richards' second-place finish in the 400 meters, gave the United States nine medals through five days of competition, 6 gold and 3 silver.

## Player kicked out of camp

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (AP) — Terrell Owens got T.O.'d — as in Thrown Out of training camp.

The All-Pro wide receiver was asked to leave Philadelphia Eagles camp Wednesday after a heated exchange with coach Andy Reid, making it the latest curious twist in a controversial career.

This time, there were no Sharpies or desperate housewives.

Instead, Reid asked the injured Owens to leave after their discussion, according to Owens' agent, Drew Rosenhaus, and his publicist, Kim Etheredge. Owens was asked to return next Wednesday.

"I got sent home until Wednesday for whatever reason," Owens told Comcast SportsNet for a TV interview at his home in Moorestown,

N.J. "It was just a difference of opinion. I was defending myself."

With reporters camped on his lawn and helicopters hovering overhead while Owens played basketball and lifted weights, the circus scene only magnified the distraction Owens has become to the NFC champions. While Owens was an instant fan favorite last year after helping the Eagles reach the Super Bowl, he's caused constant headaches for management because of his demand for a new contract.

Now comes this.

Comcast SportsNet reported the disagreement occurred during a team meeting. Owens then got his belongings and cleared out of training camp at Lehigh University. Hours after testing his injured groin on a separate playing field from his teammates, Owens was at home.
