• **GOLF**
KARUIZAWA, Japan (AP) — American teenager Paula Creamer shot a 4-under 68 and held off Ai Miyazato — Japan's most popular player — to win the NEC Karuizawa tournament. Creamer, who turned 19 earlier this month, finished at 19-under 197, three strokes ahead of Miyazato, who shot a 69.

WHEATON, Ill. (AP) — Jeff Overton gave the United States its first Walker Cup victory since 1997, beating Nigel Edwards 1-up in the deciding match in the Americans' 12 1/2-11 1/2 triumph over Britain and Ireland at Chicago Golf Club.

NAKHABINO, Russia (AP) — Mikael Lundberg of Sweden beat England's Andrew Butterfield on the fourth playoff hole to win the Russian Open, his first European Tour title. Both players finished regulation play at 15-under 273 on the 7,154-yard par-72 course at the Le Meridien Moscow Golf and Country Club.

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. (AP) — Roger Tambellini shot a 7-under 65 in the final round of the Price Cutter Charity Championship to win the Nationwide Tour event by one stroke. Tambellini two-putted birdie on the 72nd hole to put him at 21-under 267. David Peoples shot 62 to tie for second with Steven Bowditch (64), Vance Veazey (67) and third-round leader Troy Matteson (69).

• **BASEBALL**
BALTIMORE (AP) — Four days after returning to the Baltimore Orioles following a 10-day suspension for steroid use, Rafael Palmeiro played baseball for the

first time Sunday. He batted sixth as the designated hitter, which sheltered him from the 95 degree temperature and the heat of the fans at Camden Yards, many of whom booed when his name was announced during pregame introductions. Upon being suspended for steroid use on Aug. 1, Palmeiro, 40, insisted that he did not know how the drug got in his body. He has not addressed the topic since returning Thursday, saying that his attorneys advised him to refrain from comment until Congress concludes its investigation of his case.

WATKINS GLEN, N.Y. (AP) — A broken alternator couldn't keep Tony Stewart from blowing away the field one more time. Faced with a problem right at the end of a race he dominated, Stewart simply snookered the opposition on the final two restarts and cruised to his fifth victory in seven races. And his dominant performance Sunday at Watkins Glen International padded his lead in the Nextel Cup standings. Road-racing specialist Boris Said was third.
