"These programs have helped thousands of producers recover from the devastating effects of severe weather," Fuller said. "I encourage all eligible farmers and ranchers to enroll in these programs now before the sign-up periods close in order to participated and receive this valuable assistance."

The crop program provides assistance to producers who suffered 2003 or 2004 crop losses as the result of damaging weather or related conditions. Nearly \$2 billion has been paid nationwide to producers since sign-up began in mid-March.
