Colby middle schoolers fall to Ellis

The Colby Middle School seventh grade football team saw its record drop to 2-1 on Monday, Sept. 26 with a 44-40 loss to a combined seventh and eighth grade Ellis Streamliners.

The young Eagles jumped out to a 16-12 lead in the first quarter, said John Miles, head coach. Andrew Flanagan started the Eagles scoring on a 40-yard run with Sam Kendrick running in the two-point conversion. Kendrick scored on an 18-yard run with Flanagan tacking on the conversion attempt.

Ellis countered with three touchdowns in the second quarter.

Taylor Moeder scored on a 45-yard run but Ellis held on the conversion attempt to make the half-time score 32-22.

The Eagles defense toughened up in the second half by allowing Ellis lone touchdowns in the third and fourth quarters, Miles said.

Colby started their comeback in the fourth quarter with Moeder scoring on an 11-yard run.

Flanagan caught two touchdown passes of 21 and 53 yards from quar-

terback Kale Arnberger.

Ellis held on all of the conversion attempts in the second half.

"Our defense improved in the second half by shutting down Ellis' passing game," Miles said.

"Assistant Coach Scholz and I were proud of the way we came back in the fourth quarter to make it a close game."

The Colby Eagles were led on defense by Cody Crocker, Nathan Quagliano, Christian Wilson, Travis White, Ryan Parker and Josh Middleton.

Free bowhunters class scheduled on Oct. 15

Every serious bowhunter might want to consider a course on the "hows" of bowhunting, which is scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 15 at the Kirwin National Wildlife Refuge office.

The program is being sponsored by the International Bowhunter Education Foundation, said Dennis Fredrickson with the group.

"This class is a must for the beginning bowhunter and is very beneficial to the experienced bowhunter as well," he said.

Classes on field experience, bow safety, tracking and where to hunt

deer will begin at 8:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. The outdoor session includes following a realistic blood trail, identifying game sign, demonstrating equipment, such as tree stands, ground blinds and steps.

Registration is from 8 to 8:30 a.m. and classes are free. Participants are asked to bring a sack lunch.

The Kirwin National Wildlife Refuge office is six miles east of Glade and one mile south.


