

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) -Jimmie Johnson acknowledged Tuesday he was at fault for an eightcar crash at Talladega Superspeedway that scuttled at least one other driver's championship hopes.

Johnson had denied responsibility immediately after Sunday's accident, which cost both himself and Mark Martin valuable ground in the Saturday with play beginning at 9 a.m. race for the Nextel Cup title. After watching tape of the acci-

dent that occurred 20 laps into the race, Johnson said he realized he ran into the back of leader Elliott Sadler to start the wreck. Johnson initially claimed he was pushed into Sadler by Dale Earnhardt Jr.

"I feel bad, I don't know what else I can say," Johnson said. "I started a wreck and took out a lot of good cars. That was the last thing I intended to do and I feel horrible for it. So I'm taking the responsibility. "I needed to see the video to really understand what took place."

Johnson and Martin were the only two Chase for the championship drivers caught in the accident and it cost them dearly.
