

Episcopal investment panel rejects divestment

ment panel of the Episcopal Church has recommended against divesting from companies that profit from begins Friday in Las Vegas. Israeli policy in the Palestinian ter-

vestments Committee said in a report Monday that "the goal is for selected companies to change behavior resulting in a more hopeful climate for peace. If the church simply divests, nothing positive has happened."

Instead, the committee suggested that the denomination adopt a strategy of "corporate engagement," that would encourage companies to adopt practices that bring about "positive changes in Israeli government policy" towards pulling out of the territories completely, "as well as urging the Palestinian Authority to oppose violence as a means of resistance."


