Preparing for what Bill and Angie Sroufe thought would be a four-day weekend they packed four changes of clothes, Gabby the dog and perishables from the fridge. Hurricane Rita was soon to be an uninvited guest. They left Lake Charles, La. and drove six hours to Jackson, Miss. and spent five days with the mother of a colleague of Bill's. When the evacuation of Lake Charles was extended they decided to come to Kansas. Bill said, "When disaster came, family was the first thing I thought about. That's when I realized how important it is to be near my family." Bill and Angie live on the edge of the historical district of Lake Charles and still have no word whether or not their house is still standing. Angie teaches in the Calcasien Parish and their school is closed until further notice. Bill will graduate from McNeese University

"Lack of communication makes it stressful," Angie said.

They check on the Web site several times a day and will have to return on as short a notice as when they left. They hope to never experience fleeing from another hurricane. They said, nearly in unison, "We'd rather spend a few hours in a basement or shelter waiting out a tornado and know immediately the fate of our home and belongings than to wait for several weeks not knowing if our house is still there."



Vada Marie Glasco Pancake 1918 - 2005



Vada Marie Glasco, daughter of John William and Fern Marie Glasco, was born July 1, 1918, north of Gem, Kansas. She passed away October 6, 2005, at age 87 at the Lantern Park Manor rest home, Colby Vada spent her youth on her parents'

spent a few months working in Colorado In September 1941, she married Joseph L. Pancake, a farmer south-

east of Atwood, Kansas. They had two children, Samuel J. and Mary Ann. For the next forty-odd years Vada was a combination housewife, mother,

driver (the one-room school was 5 miles away), gardener, dairymaid, poultry chef, nurse or cowhand, as needed. She found pleasure in attending the local Lone Star Church and later the Atwood Methodist

Church. There were frequent Sunday dinners with relatives as she had six siblings and her husband had seven. She enjoyed preparing a "dish" for such events. She often checked out books from the Atwood Library These varied from romance novels to a biography of Einstein. In later years, her reading became increasingly religious an she became more concerned for the less fortunate. By the 1980s, she and Joe began to cut back on their cow herd and

then rented the farm out and eventually moved to Colby. She entered Lantern Park Manor rest home in 1992 where she resided until her death. She is survived by her son, Sam, of the Washington, D.C. area; a son-inlaw, Don Coffee or Oregon; brothers Glenn and his wife Millie of Bird City; Rex and his wife Mary Ellen, Tucson, Arizona; sister-in-laws Lavaughn Glasco of Goodland and Mary Glasco of Benkelman, Nebraska; brotherin-law Clarence Kamla of Missouri, and numerous nieces and nephews Vada could often find humor in the midst of difficulties. She would surely be amused that the weather and the unpaved roads that had been such a trial in her years on the farm once again have interfered with her plans. But this time she doesn't have to worry about being late. And as she would note, "We sure need the rain."

Services were held Tuesday, October 11, 2005 at Harrison Chapel in Colby, Kansas. Pallbearers were Lynn Glasco, Terry Mann, Jonathan Pancake, Gary Lovelace, Kent Ward and Delmer Pancake.
