Head coach Lynda McKee was pleased with her team's performance.

"We played some good volleyball, despite the loss to Atwood," she said. "We have a tendency to not

always hit as aggressively as we are capable of, and that allows our opponent to stay in the match."

The Bulldogs will play at home on Saturday at 10 a.m. in the Western Kansas Liberty League tournament. The team has also done well in recent competitions like the Hill City tournament, Goodland and Brewster quads.

At the Hill City tourney, the Brewster went 25-13 and 25-20 against LaCrosse; 23-25, 27-25 and 25-9 against WaKeeney; 27-25 and 25-17 against Golden Plains; 25-9 and 25-11 against Ness City and 25-2 and 25-22 against Northern Valley.
