Ethelyn LaVergne Dimmitt Dutton

Ethelyn LaVergne Dimmitt Dutton, 88, died Saturday, Oct. 1, 2005, at the University of Kansas Medical Center from a cerebral hemorrhage sustained in a fall in her home.

She was born Jan. 21, 1917, in Colby, to Jessie Pratt Dimmitt and Birch Vernon Dimmitt. She graduated from Colby High School in 1934 and attended Park College in Parkville, Mo., where in 1938 she earned a Bachelor's degree in public school music. After graduation, she moved to Page City, where she taught three years. Subjects she taught included journalism, French, math, and agriculture at the elementary and junior high school levels.

On May 31, 1941, she married Marshall Wayne Dutton at Colby First Methodist Church, and they lived in Colby for most of the 28 years that followed. In Colby, Mrs. Dutton was a member of First Methodist Church, where she sang soprano in the choir.

In 1969 they moved to Lawrence and she joined the Lawrence First United Methodist Church, where she remained a member until her death. She enjoyed music, needlework, genealogy, playing bridge and reading.

Mrs. Dutton is survived by five daughters and a son, four sons-inlaw, and a daughter-in-law: Marsha Dutton and her husband R. T. Lenaghan of Athens, Ohio; Kathleen Lange and Phillip Lange of Topeka; Judith Dutton of Lawrence; Tamara Dutton and Timothy Miller of Lawrence; Daryl Ann Dutton Cody and Martin Cody of Volcano, Calif.; and Marshall William Dutton (Bill) and Lynda Dutton of Kennewick, Wash.; 17 grandchildren and seven greatgrandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her husband, parents, brother James Lloyd Dimmitt, and an infant grandson.
