Jurors decide on facility's operation

WICHITA (AP) — Prosecutors said Thursday that a Newton couple operated a "house of horrors kept financially afloat by fraud" in which they enslaved mentally ill residents and forced them to work naked and engage in sexual acts, while billing the government and their families for the therapy.

Arlan Kaufman, 69, and his wife, Linda, 62, are being tried in U.S. District Court on more than 30 federal charges — including health care fraud, Medicare fraud, forced labor and holding clients in involuntary servitude — related to the treatment of residents at the Kaufman House Residential Treatment Center.

Jurors, who began deliberating the case Thursday afternoon, did not reach a verdict and went home for the evening.

They were to resume deliberations today.

Arlan Kaufman's defense attorney, Tom Haney, closed out his case saying video footage of the alleged crimes proved nothing other than successful treatment.

Haney also said government agencies have been after the social worker for decades for his unconventional therapy.

Hospital accredited on mammography

Citizens Medical Center, Inc. in Colby has been awarded a three-year term of accreditation in mammography as the result of a recent survey by the American College of Radiology.

"The American College of Radiology awards accreditation to facilities for the achievement of high practice standards after a peer-review evaluation of the practice," said Tama Unger, director of fund development and community relations.

"Evaluations are conducted by board-certified physicians and medical physicists who are experts in the field."

Unger said in order to qualify for accreditation the hospital's personnel and equipment had to qualify.

"The surveyors report their findings to the college's committee on

accreditation, which subsequently provides the practice with a comprehensive report," Unger said.

The American College of Radiology, headquartered in Reston, Va., is a national organization serving more than 32,000 diagnostic and interventional radiologists, radiation oncologists, and medical physicists with programs focusing on the practice of medical imaging and radiation oncology and the delivery of comprehensive health care services. Mammography is important for the detection of breast cancer.

"The earlier cancer can be detected the better ones chance of surviving the disease. Mammography is our only means of detecting a tumor that is too small to be felt," Unger said. For information, call 785) 462-7511.
