Crudités with Vegetable Cream Cheese Dip: Slice your favorite veggies into strips and serve with Alpine Lace flavored fat-free cream cheese of your choice.

Puree of Yellow Squash Soup (adapted from Mollie Katzens "Still Life with Menu"): one pound yellow squash (crookneck) - about six small ones; two cups chopped onion; two medium cloves garlic, minced; cooking spray; two teaspoons minced fresh thyme (or 1/2teaspoon dried); two teaspoons fresh sage, chopped (or 1/2 teaspoon dried); one to two teaspoons minced fresh basil (or 1/2 teaspoon dried); one teaspoon salt; one tablespoon unbleached white flour; onehalf cup dry white wine; two cups skim milk; freshly ground black pepper.

Cut the ends off the squash and cut into 1/4 inch slices. Set aside. In a large saucepan or Dutch oven,

After about five minutes, add squash, herbs and salt. Stir, cover and cook about 10 minutes more. Gradually sprinkle the flour, stirring constantly. Continue to stir over low heat for five minutes. Pour in wine, stir briefly, cover and let simmer at least 20 minutes, stirring carefully every five minutes.

Remove from heat and allow the soup to cool enough to puree it.

Puree the soup with milk in a food processor until smooth (I needed to use two batches-A) and return it to the soup pot. Adjust the seasonings and add black pepper to taste. Heat gently just before serving.
